Parent/Carer Guidance - Coronavirus-related Absence Procedures- Specialist Provision Guidance

What to do if...	Action needed	Return to school when...
My child has coronavirus symptoms	<p>Do not come to school. Contact the school daily. Self-isolate. Get a test. Inform the school immediately of the test results.</p>	<p>Negative test result has been achieved.</p> <p>Send proof of negative test result to the school prior to returning.</p> <p>or</p> <p>A period of 14 days has passed, and the child no longer has a temperature (cough and changed sense of smell and taste may last for several weeks after the infection is gone).</p>
My child tests positive for coronavirus	<p>Do not come to school. Contact the school daily. Self-isolate for 14 days. Inform the school immediately of the test results.</p> <p>If your child develops symptoms during the isolation period, 14-day isolation must restart from this point.</p> <p>Self-isolate the whole household for 14 days.</p> <p>Log into the Test and Trace website and provide information about recent close contacts.</p>	<p>They feel better. They can return to school after 14 days.</p> <p>Symptoms can last for several weeks once the virus has gone.</p> <p>Send proof of negative test result to the school prior to returning.</p>
Somebody in my household has coronavirus symptoms	<p>Do not come to school. Contact the school daily.</p> <p>Self-isolate the whole household for 14 days.</p> <p>Household member to get a test Inform the school immediately of the test results</p>	<p>The household member test is negative.</p> <p>Send proof of negative test result to the school prior to returning.</p>
Somebody in my household has tested positive for the coronavirus	<p>Do not come to school. Contact the school daily.</p> <p>Whole household to self-isolate for 14 days.</p>	<p>The child has completed 14 days of self- isolation.</p>

What to do if...	Action needed	Return to school when...
NHS test & trace have identified my child as a 'close contact' of somebody with symptoms or confirmed coronavirus	<p>Do not come to school. Contact the school daily.</p> <p>Self-isolate for 14 days.</p>	The child has completed 14 days of self- isolation.
NHS test and trace has identified a household member (other than my child) as a close contact of somebody with Covid-19	<p>The individual household member must self-isolate for 14 days.</p> <p>Other people in the household do not need to self-isolate</p>	The child can continue to attend school.
My child has travelled abroad and has to self-isolate as part of a period of quarantine	<p>Do not take unauthorised leave in term time.</p> <p>Consider quarantine requirements & FCO advice when booking travel.</p> <p>Provide information to the school as per the attendance policy.</p> <p>Returning from a destination where quarantine is needed: Do not come to school . Contact the school daily.</p> <p>Self-isolate for 14 days.</p>	The child has completed the 14 days quarantine of self-isolation.
Someone else in our household has travelled from a place requiring quarantine, but my child did not travel	<p>If no one in the household has symptoms, then your child can come to school as normal.</p> <p>The person who has travelled must not leave the house, including to do pick- ups and drop offs.</p>	The child can continue to attend school.
We have received medical advice that my child must resume shielding.	<p>Do not come to school. Contact the school as required.</p> <p>Shield until you are informed that restrictions are lifted & shielding is paused again.</p>	The school informs you that restrictions have been lifted and your child can return to school again.
I am unable to get a test for someone in the household who has symptoms	<p>Do not come to school. Contact the school for support.</p> <p>If you are not able to get a test, then the whole household must stay at home and self-isolate for 14 days.</p> <p>Anyone in your support bubble must also stay at home.</p>	The child has completed 14 days of isolation.
